Teton Raptor Center offers Ambassador Orientation for All Volunteers

Jackson, Wyoming – On January 10th, Teton Raptor Center (TRC) will host Ambassador Appreciation Night to recognize and celebrate current volunteers. Prior to the celebration, TRC will host an orientation for new volunteers interested in joining the TRC team. The event will take place at St. John's Episcopal Church in downtown Jackson, WY. Orientation will run from 5:30-6:15 pm and the celebration will follow from 6:15 to 8pm. During this annual event, TRC celebrates all volunteers who contribute time and talent to TRC. Special awards are handed out to honor individuals who have gone above and beyond to support raptor conservation. Food and refreshments will be provided along with games and prizes. Those attending the orientation before the party are encouraged to stay for the celebration.

During Ambassador Appreciation Night, TRC will honor Ambassador-of-the-Year, the "Golden Owl", Junior Ambassador-of-the-Year, TRC Heroes, and Avian Artist Award. In 2017, volunteers at Teton Raptor Center cumulatively gave 8,000 hours in service to advance raptor conservation. Ambassadors support every aspect of Teton Raptor Center's work including raptor husbandry, support at special events, administrative assistance, and research in the field. Many TRC Ambassadors contribute more than 100 hours of service to TRC annually and are inducted into the Talon Society.
