
Raptor Care Intern (FT - 1 year)

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION



The Raptor Care Intern will be responsible for ensuring avian ambassadors and patients are cared for in accordance with TRC's protocols, all state and federal wildlife regulations, and TRC permits under the direction of the Roost Coordinator and Clinic Coordinator. The primary work environments for the Raptor Care Intern will be in the Clinic, Patient Care Unit and Flight Barn to provide and learn about the care and treatment of raptor patients, and the Roost - home to eleven permanent avian ambassadors. In addition to these duties, the Raptor Care Intern will support delivery of TRC's education programs and engage in program logistics, communications, and other projects. The season and program demand will play a role in the division of labor. Teton Raptor Center cares for birds 365 days a year. The Raptor Care Intern is expected to share out responsibilities working weekends, holidays, and evenings.

QUALIFICATIONS & SKILLS

- B.S. in a science-related field or equivalent work experience preferred
- A valid driver's license
- Excellent organizational skills and an attention to detail
- Knowledge of science, natural history, and avian wildlife
- A strong work ethic and the ability to stay focused in a fast-paced environment
- Writing/oratory skills and comfort with public speaking
- Ability to work some weekends, evenings, and holidays on a rotating basis
- Ability to perform physical tasks such as lifting up to 40 lbs. / on your feet for up to 8 hours
- An ability to work well in a tight-knit team environment and independently
- Spanish language proficiency (desired but not required)
- A love of nature, wildlife, education, and conservation
- Interest or knowledge in raptor training techniques

RESPONSIBILITIES

Avian Husbandry & Rehabilitation 70%

- Daily care/cleaning/handling of avian ambassadors and patients.
- Prepare daily diets for avian ambassadors and patients.
- Assist with training and enrichment for avian ambassadors.



- Assist with handling injured raptors and patient care
- Administer medications.
- Report health or well-being concerns of ambassadors to the Roost Coordinator.
- Contribute to the upkeep of roost and clinic records and databases.
- Assist volunteers during the daily roost and clinic care routine.
 Opportunities for mentoring volunteers might be provided.



Education Programs 20%

- Assist with formal and informal education programs on and off-site with and without live birds, and with volunteers.
- Prepare, set up, transfer, and clean up for daily programs.
- Contribute content for TRC's various digital platforms (FB, Insta, YouTube, etc.).

Special Projects & Professional Development 10%

- Complete special projects as assigned by the Roost Coordinator and Clinic Coordinator.
- Identify and complete independent projects that will benefit TRC's avian programs.
 - Examples include but are not limited to: protocol updates, maintenance projects, re-organization projects, creative writing pieces, case studies, etc.
- General maintenance of buildings and grounds on the historic property. Opportunities for campus stewardship.
- Actively seek out and regularly participate in professional development and continued education related to avian husbandry, training, enrichment, and raptor care.
- Participate in other aspects of TRC's work (e.g., operations and research) to enhance understanding of the holistic aspects of TRC's mission of raptor conservation.
